



2020 Stay@Home May Holiday Bootcamp GCE 'A' JC2 History H2

The primary objective for the June bootcamp is to prepare JC2 students for their mid-year exams after the holidays.

This 18-hour H2 History bootcamp aims to provide students with an overview of all topics covered in both Papers 1 & 2, and how to connect learning outcomes and the syllabus covered in school. On top of clarifying doubts on each key topic, the bootcamp also provides opportunities for students to have hands-on practice on tackling both sample essay and source-based questions.

Students will acquire valuable techniques to best approach these questions and the common pitfalls to avoid. Students who need revision and that extra push for the mid-term examinations will find these lessons helpful.
